



Guilty plea entered in stabbing death

A 21-year-old Mississauga man charged with first-degree murder in the stabbing death of a Brampton roofer two years ago will appear in court again on Nov. 21.

Sheldon Keough is charged in the killing of 28-year-old Paul Medeiros, who died from a single stab wound to his heart during a confrontation on Oct. 21, 2005 outside Careca Sports Bar in Brampton.

Meanwhile, another man charged in the case pleaded guilty today to manslaughter. Christopher Browne, 24, of Brampton pleaded guilty to his role in the death, admitting he killed Medeiros, a man he never knew, during the dispute. Browne, who had been charged with first-degree murder, will be sentenced Jan. 21.

Americo Eduardo Quiroz, 28, of Mississauga remains charged with accessory after the fact to murder. Americo Eduardo Quiroz is represented by defense counsel, Anser Farooq.



Man plead guilty to obstruction in connection with slaying

BRAMPTON- A Mississauga man has pleaded guilty to obstruction of justice in connection with a Brampton murder investigation two years ago.

Americo Eduardo Quiroz, 28, was originally charged with being accessory after the fact of murder, but that charge was withdrawn in court on Monday.

"Mr. Quiroz is relieved that this ordeal has come to an end," said Anser Farooq.

The original charge was laid soon after Paul Medeiros, 28, was stabbed to death by a stranger outside Careca Sports Bar on Clarence Street near Kennedy Road in October 2005.
